Experience Salisbury

Salisbury is a wonderfully intimate city, set in beautiful Wiltshire countryside. Five rivers, the Cathedral Close, medieval buildings, green spaces and water meadows – Salisbury is a city on a human scale, a city made for exploring.

Britain's most iconic cathedral

The magnificent Salisbury **Cathedral** is set in Britain's largest Cathedral Close and has the tallest spire in the country. Standing at a breath-taking 404ft / 123m, the cathedral has been quiding travellers to Salisbury city for over 800 years. It is home to one of four surviving original 1215 Magna Carta documents, the world's oldest working clock which is thought to date back to medieval times in 1386, and the most maiestic stainedglass windows. Salisbury Cathedral hosts regular events, exhibitions and festivals throughout the year.

A museum of national importance

The award-winning **Salisbury** Museum tells the stories of a unique landscape which has been the cradle of continuous human achievement for over half a million years, and of the people who shaped it and continue to shape it today from Stonehenge to Medieval Salisbury, from the drainage collection to the new fashion gallery. The museum is home to a year-round programme of inspirational exhibitions and events, all housed in a beautiful medieval building located in the historic Cathedral Close.

Mompesson House is a quintessential Queen Anne townhouse in the Cathedral Close and location for the film Sense and Sensibility. It's easy to imagine living here as you walk down the fine oak staircase, admire the plasterwork and collection of 18th-century drinking glasses and relax in the library. The tranquil, secluded walled garden and tearoom provide an oasis of calm.

A regimental museum

The Wardrobe is a museum that details the fascinating history of the Berkshire and Wiltshire Regiments. The collections are vast with over 16,000 photographs, 6,000 archive documents, 4,000 medals, almost a thousand items of uniform and about 500 weapons. The garden has mature trees, planted areas and a lawn flowing down to the river. The Rifleman's Table serves delicious locally sourced food.

UNESCO World Heritage Site

Stonehenge, England's greatest mystery, is located just 10-miles north of the city of Salisbury. This prehistoric monument which dates back to 3000BC is one of many Neolithic and Bronze Age sites in the local area, extending to Avebury and beyond. 

Our centrally located coach park holds 23 coaches and


